Campus Safety Manual

Shelia discussed Safety Training and needs.


- AED/CPR – All AED Directors must have AED/CPR training. We will host a training event with Campus REC in June.
- EH&S will send out another email making sure AED Directors understand their requirements such as training, inspections, maintenance, etc.
- Bloodborne Pathogen Training – EH&S is working with departments noted in the Exposure Control Plan (CH8 of the Campus Safety Manual) to get their training in compliance.

Emergency Operations Case Study

Alan summarized the event in October where our Emergency Operations Plan and multiple departments on and off campus worked together to make sure that our campus was safe. Chief Peaster also discussed how well the departments worked together and how important it was to keep the groups separated that wanted to protest safely. Since the League of the South had made it an official event Rutherford County could separate the groups and have required entrances and exits so that seemed to keep the event from getting out of control. University Police did an excellent job preparing for the event and noted that everyone made it a success.
